Interior designer Ashley Astleford thinks "neutral" is a dirty word.

"Stark," "pale" and "monochromatic" aren't usually in her vocabulary either. Instead, her signature style, which she calls Hacienda Chic, goes beyond design clichés and brings bold elements to any space.

"My goal is to mix modern and Mexican elements into a sophisticated, balanced look," Ashley explains. The designer, who loves Latin and Spanish fashion, food
